XVI. out of her other private funds, the sum of four thousand dollars, and that the balance remaining due to her and her children from her mother's estate, would be more than sufficient to discharge the residue of the purchase money; that she is willing and desirous to settle the whole real estate, so purchased by her, on her children, (reserving nevertheless her life estate,) provided a law should pass authorising a trustee to collect and receive her proportion of her mother's estate, and to apply such part thereof as may be sufficient to discharge the balance of the purchase money due for the said land, and therefore prayed a law might pass for that purpose,

1. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Alexander M. Donald, of the city of Baltimore, be and he is hereby appointed trustee for the said Eliza Mathews, and her children, for the purposes in this act mentioned, and that the said trustee shall have the same power and authority, as was given by the said will to the trustees uamed therein; Provided nevertheless, that the said Alexander M.
