CHAP, CLXXIII.

An Act to relieve the Lotteries authorised to be drawn for the benefit of the Port- Passed Feb 14 1820 Tobacco Church from the Taxes imposed thereon.

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Lottery exempt lotteries authorised to be drawn for the benefit of the Port-Tobacco church, be and they are hereby exempted from the payment of the taxes authorised by the laws of this state, to be claimed on the prizes to be drawn in this state.

2. And be it enacted, That the said lotteries shall be liable to pay To pay one per one per cent. on the prizes to be drawn, to be applied to the payment of the salaries which may become due to the commissioners of lotteries, and their clerk, during the year in which the said lot-

teries may be drawn.

CHAP. CLXXIV.

An Act empowering the Judges of Elections to administer Oaths appertaining to Passed Feb 14, 1820 Elections.

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall Judges of election may administer and may be lawful for the several judges of elections within this oaths in certain state, to administer an oath, or an affirmation, in any inquiry which case they may deem necessary to be made touching the right of any person offering to vote, and if any person or persons shall swear or affirm falsely and corruptly, in relation thereto, such person or persons shall, upon conviction thereof, suffer the pains and penalties provided for those convicted of perjury.

CHAP. CLXXV.

A Further Supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the preservation of the Passed Feb 14 1820 Breed of Fish.

1.
