CHAP. CLXXIX.

An Act for the Relief of Rufus Eddy.

Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from Commissioners au-and after the passage of this act, the commissioners of insolvent to him benefit of debtors for the city and county of Baltimore, be authorised, and they are hereby authorised, to receive the application of Rufus Eddy of the city of Baltimore, for the benefit of the insolvent laws of this state, and to act upon and report the same to the county court, without requiring proof of his residence in the state two years prior to such application, and the county court of Baltimore is empowered to give the said Rufus Eddy a discharge, provided he shall comply with all the other requisites of the insolvent laws of this state.

CHAP. CLXXX.

An Act for the relief of Joseph Tomkins, of the City of Baltimore. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Benefit of insoljudges of the county court of Baltimore county, and the commis-vent laws authorised to be extended in the city of Baltimore, be and they ed to him are hereby authorised and required, to afford to Joseph Tompkins the benefit of the insolvent laws of this state, in as full and ample manner, to every intent and purpose, as if he had resided two whole years in this state before the time of his application for the same, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
