- (bb-1). In Kent County, as the TO Classes B and D (on sale) beer, wine and liquor licenses, this section shall be applicable between the hours of midnight on Saturday and [8] 6 A. M. on Monday and between the hours of [midnight] 1 A. M. and [8] 6 A. M. on the following day on every weekday.
- 97. Kent County. In Kent County, notwithstanding any other provision of this sub-title, it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or for any retail dealer to give alcoholic beverages between the hours of midnight on Saturday and 6 A. M. on Monday. Any person selling or any retail dealer giving alcoholic beverages in Kent County between the hours of midnight on Saturday and 6 A.. M. on Monday shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof shall be fined not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense, and for each succeeding offense shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for not more than thirty (30) days or be both fined and imprisoned, in the discretion of the court.
