SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 148(g) of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

(g) This section shall be applicable in Baltimore City, and (except as otherwise provided) in Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Prince George's, Talbot, Washington, Wicomico, [and] Worcester and Baltimore counties.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1959.

## CHAPTER 734

## (House Bill 66)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 1 of Article 63 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Mechanics' Lien", sub-title "In General", relating to the exemption of buildings for which the labor and materials have been paid and which has been conveyed to a bona fide purchaser for value without notice.

WHEREAS, IT IS THE LEGISLATIVE INTENT OF THIS BILL TO ADOPT THE DISSENTING OPINION IN THE CASE OF CLARK CERTIFIED CONCRETE COMPANY V. LINDEBERG, 141 ATLANTIC SECOND, 685,

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 1 of Article 63 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Mechanics' Lien", sub-title "In General", be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and to read as follows:

1. To what and for what lien attaches.

Every building erected and every building repaired, rebuilt or improved to the extent of one-fourth its value in Baltimore City and in any of the counties shall be subject to a lien for the payment of all debts contracted for work done for or about the same, and for materials furnished for or about the same, including the drilling and installation of wells for the purpose of supplying water, the sodding,
