ruffed grouse, rabbit, or hare, partridges (quail)

Male deer, with two or more points to one antler, provided male deer with an antler three or more inches long, with the points measuring from the top of the skull as the deer is in life, bear season for the hunting of deer. It shall be unlawful to hunt or kill any dove in Garrett County at any time.

May be hunted, pursued, or killed for a period of [six] seven days beginning the first [Monday] Saturday in December, except on the Woodmont Rod and Gun Club in Washington County, December 15 to December 24, inclusive, provided, that in counties having a bow and arrow season, deer of either sex can be killed between October 15 and November 15, by means of a bow and arrow. Antlerless deer may be hunted, pursued or killed by special permit, for a period AT ANY TIME for not more than one day during the week immediately following the open season on male deer in such counties or portions of counties as established by regulation of the Game and Inland Fish Commission except that no such period for hunting antlerless deer shall be authorized in Frederick, Allegany, Washington and Garrett counties.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1959.

CHAPTER 153

(Senate Bill 135)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 255 (e) of Article 93 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Testamentary Law", sub-title "Orphans' Court", relating to the compensation of Judges of the Orphans' Court of Worcester County and relating generally thereto.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 255 (e) of Article 93 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Testamentary Law", sub-title "Orphans' Court", be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
