CHAPTER 204

(Senate Bill 270)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, sub-section (o) (1) of Section 37 of Article 87 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended), title "Sheriffs", sub-title "Compensation and Duties" providing for allowances for expenses for the Sheriff of Montgomery County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sub-section (o) (1) of Section 37 of Article 87 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition, as amended), title "Sheriffs" sub-title "Compensation and Duties", be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

37.

(o) Montgomery County.—(1) [Until December 31, 1958, the] *The Sheriff of Montgomery County shall receive an annual salary of [\$4,800] ~~\$7,500~~ \$7,500 per year, and such allowances for expenses, commencing on January 1, 1959, as the County Council of said county shall provide from its annual budget [; and the said sheriff from and after January 1, 1959, shall receive an annual salary of \$7,500 per year].* The County Council of Montgomery County shall provide an automobile for the use of the said sheriff and his deputies FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC WORK OF THE OFFICE; THE SAID AUTOMOBILE TO BE OPERATED AND MAINTAINED BY THE SAID SHERIFF AND HIS DEPUTIES at the expense of said Montgomery County.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and being passed upon a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.
