lic, idiot or person insane, and receiving proof to his satisfaction that it is necessary or proper to confine such lunatic, idiot or person insane, to direct such trustee to send the person under his charge to the hospital in the vicinity of the city of Baltimore: *Provided*, He can be there received, to remain until the further order of the court of chancery.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the chancellor shall have power, at any time to order and direct the removal to the said hospital of any lunatic, idiot or person insane, who hath heretofore, under his direction, been sent to any hospital or receptacle in Philadelphia, and to enforce his order as in other cases.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the seventh section of the act of assembly, passed at November session one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, entitled, "an act relative to proceedings in the court of chancery and land offices, and to the real estate of persons dying intestate," be and the same is hereby repealed.

#### CHAPTER 22.

*An act authorising the several banks in this state to loan money to the state of Maryland.*

Sec. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That each of the several banking institutions within the state of Maryland, be, and hereby are authorised to loan to the said state any sum of money not exceeding in amount one-third of its capital actually paid in.

#### CHAPTER 23.

Preamble

*An act for the payment of the journal of accounts.*  
WHEREAS, It appears by the journal of accounts of this session, that there is due from the state the sum of nine thousand eight hundred and forty seven dollars and twenty eight cents :

Sec. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the Western Shore shall, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns or order, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of any money now in the treasury, or that shall come into the treasury, subject to the appropriation of the general assembly.
