II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Stephen Wil-Commissionson, Charles Crookshanks, Hercules Courtenay, John Holmes and John Mickle, ers appointed, &c. or any three of them, shall be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and open the following streets in Baltimore-town, of the width of forty feet; that is to fay, from Fayette-street, in Howard's Addition to the said town, to King-Tammany-street, from thence to Chatham-street, and from thence to Calvert-street; and the said streets, when so laid out and opened, and the valuation and affessment herein after directed to be made shall have taken place, shall be deemed and taken, and are hereby declared to be, a public street and highway for ever thereafter; and the said commissioners are hereby directed to return a plot, ascertaining the extent and limits of the said street when so extended and opened, to the clerk of Baltimore county court, who shall receive and file the same as part of the plot of Baltimore-town.

III. and be it enacted, That the faid commissioners, or any three or more of Who shall asthem, after having given ten days public notice thereof by advertisement in the est damages, Maryland Journal, shall proceed to assess and value what damages shall be suftained by any person or persons whatsoever, by reason of extending the aforesaid streets, taking all benefits and inconveniences into consideration, and shall return the same, under their hands and seals, to the clerk of Baltimore county

IV. And be it enacted, That the faid commissioners, or any three of them, And consider after having given public notice as aforesaid, shall meet and take into considera-the benefits, tion what benefit the property of each individual shall derive from extending the aforesaid street, and shall declare what sum of money each individual, so benefited, shall respectively contribute and pay towards compensating the persons injured by extending and opening the faid ftreet, and the names of the persons, and the fums which they shall be obliged to pay, shall be returned, under their hands and feals as aforefaid, and filed with the faid clerk; and the person or persons benefited by opening the faid streets, and affessed as aforesaid, shall respectively pay interest on the sums with which shall be affessed, at the rate of six per cent. from the time limitted for the payment thereof.

VI. And be it enacted, That the sums of money affested and charged to each Sums affested individual benefited by extending and opening the aforesaid streets, shall be a lien &c. upon and bind all the property so benefited thereby to the full amount thereof.

VII. And he it enacted, That in case the persons injured by opening and ex- Damages untending the said streets shall not be paid the damages by them respectively suf- fued for, &c. tained, and affessed as aforesaid, within six months after the same shall be afcertained, the said commissioners, or the survivors of them, shall be and they are empowered and required to institute a suit, in Baltimore county court, for the recovery thereof, in which it shall be sufficient to declare for money had and received, and this act, and the proceedings under the same, shall be evidence to support such action or actions, and shall apply the money recovered towards satisfying the individuals injured by extending the said streets, or to such persons as

shall pay, or give bond to secure them.
