CHAP. XLVIII.

and the said commissioners, or any three of them, are hereby authorised to lay off and open as aforefaid, at the expence of the subscribers to said petition, a good road, sufficient for the passage of any carts or waggons; not exceeding thirty-three feet wide, from the town of Federalsburgh, on the north-west fork of Nanticoke river, in Dorchester county, to Cratcher's ferry in the said county; and the faid road, when so laid out and opened, and cleared and completed at the expence of the faid subscribers, and after the valuation herein after directed to be made, and the damages hereby directed to be affeffed shall be paid, or secured, to the individuals concerned, shall be recorded among the records of Dorchester county court, and be thereafter deemed and taken to be a public road for ever, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as other public roads are directed to be kept in the faid county.

III. And be it enacted, That the faid commissioners may appoint one of their Who may apnumber as treasurer, who is hereby enjoined and empowered to collect and receive furer, &c. all monies subscribed, or that may be subscribed, for the purpose of laying out and clearing the faid road, and fuch fubscribers are hereby directed to pay their feveral subscriptions to the treasurer appointed as aforesaid; and if any person shall neglect or refuse to pay the sum subscribed, the said treasurer, or any of the said commissioners in the name of the whole, may and is hereby authorised to sue for, recover and receive the same; and the said monies, when received, shall be applied by the said commissioners, or any two of them, to the purposes of this act.

IV. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid shall ascertain and And ascertain value what damages may be sustained by any person or persons through whose damages, &c. lands the faid road may pass, by opening and clearing the same, and the said valuation shall be made before the said commissioners shall proceed to open and clear the same; and in case any proprietor or proprietors, or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by the valuation of the said commisfioners, it shall and may be lawful for any justice of the peace of Dorchester county, on application by any person interested, to issue his warrant, under hand and seal, directed to any constable of the county aforesaid, commanding him to summon five freeholders, difinterested as to the said road, to appear, on a day by him to be appointed, on the land of the person making application as aforesaid; and the faid freeholders shall respectively repair to some justice of the peace for the faid county, and take the following oath, or affirmation, to wit: "I, A. B. "do swear, or solemnly, sincerely and truly declare and affirm, that I will "honestly and faithfully estimate and value the damages and injury sustained by "C. D. in pursuance of the directions of this act;" and shall return the damages by them affeffed to the said justices of the peace; and the damages so affessed and returned shall be conclusive, and the party or parties, in whose favour the valuation ascertained by the said commissioners, or the damages assessed by the said freeholders, shall be made, shall be entitled to receive the same from the said commissioners; and the said commissioners shall pay, or secure to be paid, the amount of the faid valuation or damages to the respective parties entitled to receive the same, out of the monies to be raised and collected from the subscriptions to the said road, within six months after the ascertainment of such valuation or damages, and before they shall proceed to affect the lands and tenements of the person or persons concerned; provided, that the said road shall not go through any houses, gardens, meadows or orchards, unless with the consent of the owner thereof.

C H A P. XLIX. An ACT to authorise the register of the land-office to issue a patent Passed De. to Salathiel Fitchett for lot number fix in Nanticoke manor.

THEREAS it hath been represented to this general assembly, by the Preamble. petition of John Henry, administrator of John Brown, John Eccles, ton and Salathiel Fitchett, that the late John Brown, of Dorchester county, purchased the lot number six, of the commissioners for the preservation and fale of confiscated British property, lying in Nanticoke manor, which, by
