V. and, whereas doubts have been entertained, whether any quaker, menonist or tunker, can act as a surveyor or chain carrier under the act to which this a supplement; therefore, Be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this Affirmation to be valid, &c. act, an affirmation made by any quaker, menonist or tunker, shall be as valid as an oath, in order to qualify the faid quaker, menonist or tunker, either as a surveyor or chain carrier.

> C H A P. LXXI.

An ACT for streightening and amending the road from the town Paffed December 28. of Cumberland, in Allegany county, which interfects the road leading from Union-town, in Pennsylvania, at the Winding-

Preamble. HEREAS the state of Pennsylvania hath laid out, opened and amended, a road from Union-town, in Fayette county, to the division line: And whereas the faid road will be of no benefit unless this state streighten and amend the road from the town of Cumberland to intersect the said road at the Winding-Ridge; and it appearing to this general affembly that the fame will be of confiderable advantage to this state, by opening a better commu-

nication with the Western country; therefore,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That George Dent, Commissioners appointed, William M'Mahon and Evan Gwynne, or any two of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to survey, streighten and amend, at the expence of those who have or may subscribe to the same, a road not exceeding forty feet in width, in the best and most convenient direction from the town of Cumberland, in Allegany county, to a tract of land called Good Will, and from thence to interfect the main road from Union-town, in the state of Pennsylvania, where the faid road enters this state at the Winding-Ridge; and the faid road, when so opened at the expence of the persons aforesaid, and the valuation herein after directed to be made shall be paid, or secured to be paid, to the individuals concerned, shall be recorded among the records of Allegany county, and be thereafter deemed and taken to be a public road for ever.

III. And he it enacted, That the said commissioners may appoint one of their Who may apnumber as treasurer, and give him a certificate under their hands of his appointpoint a treafürer, &c. ment, who is hereby enjoined and empowered to collect and receive all monies fubscribed, or that may be subscribed, for the purposes aforesaid, and such subscribers are hereby directed to pay their several subscriptions to the treasurer appointed as aforesaid, or to his order; and if any persons shall neglect or refuse, when applied to by the faid treasurer, or any person authorised by him, to pay his fubscription money, the said treasurer, or person by him authorised, may and he is hereby authorifed and directed to fue for, recover, and receive the same; and

the faid monies, when received, shall be applied by the commissioners, or any two of them, to the purposes of this act.

IV. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid shall ascertain and damages, &c. value what damages may be sustained by any person or persons through whose land the faid road may pass by opening the same, and the faid valuation shall be made before the said commissioners shall proceed to open the same; provided always, that if any person or persons through whose land the said road shall pass, or his, her or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by fuch valuation and affefiment of damages by the faid commissioners, it shall and may be lawful for any justice of the peace of the county in which such aggrieved persons reside, on application of the party interested, to issue his warrant, under hand and feal, directed to any constable of the county, commanding him to fummon five freeholders, difinterested as to the said road, to appear, on a day by him. to be appointed, on the land of the person making application as aforesaid, and
