Dear Mr. Speaker:

I have today vetoed House Bill No. 955 and in accordance with the provisions of Article 2, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I am returning this bill to you along with my veto message.

House Bill No. 955, which was introduced by Delegate E. Homer White, Jr., of Wicomico County, was designed to make it illegal to carry fire arms, other than shot guns, on any boat in this State which was engaged in the tonging of oysters.

Since the adjournment of the General Assembly, the sponsor of this bill has contacted my office and advised that the bill as amended does not accomplish the purpose for which it was introduced and he has requested that I veto the same.

The Chairman of the Department of Tidewater Fisheries has also advised that the bill, in its final form, is undesirable and deserving of my veto.
