Subject: "COURTS", sub-title "MUNICIPAL COURT OF BALTIMORE CITY", RELATING GENERALLY TO THE JURISDICTION AND SENTENCING POWER OF SAID COURT; Subject: "CRIMES AND PUNISHMENTS", sub-title "FALSE PRETENSES, BAD CHECKS, ETC.", PROVIDING THAT IN BALTIMORE CITY FALSE PRETENCES INVOLVING LESS THAN \$100 SHALL NOT BE PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT IN THE PENITENTIARY; sub-title "LARCENY—HORSES OR VEHICLES", DELETING THE PENITENTIARY AS A PLACE OF PUNISHMENT FOR UNAUTHORIZED USE; Subject: "JUSTICES OF THE PEACE", SECTION 13, SHALL NOT BE APPLICABLE TO SAID SECTION 349; Subject "STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE", sub-title "AID TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN", DELETING THE PROVISION THAT THE OFFENSE OF UNLAWFULLY OBTAINING ASSISTANCE SHALL BE PUNISHABLE AS FALSE PRETENSES, ETC.
