Senate Bill No. 10—By Senator Malkus:

Subject: "STATE ROADS", sub-title "REFUNDING BONDS FOR ISSUES UNDER SECTIONS 106 TO 118 OF THIS ARTICLE", sub-heading "STATE HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION BONDS, SECOND ISSUE", PROVIDING THAT THE STATE ROADS COMMISSION SHALL NOT ISSUE IN ANY FISCAL YEAR ON BEHALF OF DORCHESTER COUNTY, BONDS IN EXCESS OF THE FACE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000).
