This particular bill was designed to permit an additional three-day open season for the hunting of antlerless deer in five counties in our State.

House Bill No. 408, which, among other things, accomplishes this same result, was signed into law on April 24, 1961.

In order to prevent any duplication, I feel it necessary to veto this Senate Bill.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 132 (a) of Article 66C of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1960 Supplement), title "Natural Resources", sub-title "Birds, Game and Inland Water Fish", sub-heading "Upland and Migratory Game Birds and Came Animals", providing that in Dorchester County there shall be a three-day open season for the hunting of antlerless deer and relating generally to the time for and the conditions of this open season.
