Senate Bill No. 305—Subdivisions in Calvert County

AN ACT to add new Section 396A to Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Health", sub-title "Water, Ice and Sewerage", to follow immediately after Section 396 thereof, relating to minimum health requirements for lots and plats of subdivisions in Calvert County, and providing for procedure to appeal refusal to approve plats of subdivisions in the county.

Dear Mr. President:

I have today vetoed Senate Bill No. 459 and in accordance with the provisions of Article 2, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I am returning this bill to you along with my veto message.

This office was advised by the Attorney General by letter dated April 25, 1961, that in the opinion of that office, Senate Bill No. 459 does not meet with the provisions of the Maryland Constitution. That particular letter is attached to this veto message and is intended to be a part of it.
