Amendment No. 4—Strike out all of Lines 9, 10, and 11 of Section 2A of the Printed Bill and insert in lieu thereof the following: “and assisting in the relocation of persons who reside in or occupy any property which may be acquired by whatever manner for the proposed East-West Radial Highway, and the establishment and operation of such relocation office shall be considered as one of the things necessary, proper or expedient in connection with the matters or things mentioned in Section 2 hereof. Provided, however, that nothing contained in this Section 2A shall apply to, or be taken or construed to affect, directly or indirectly, any of the Certificates of Indebtedness of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, or the issuance or sale thereof, or the expenditure or use of any proceeds derived from the sale of such Certificates of Indebtedness, which the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is empowered to issue and sell by an appropriate ordinance or ordinances of said municipality passed, and by the approval of any such ordinance or ordinances by a majority of the voters of Baltimore City at any election held in said city, prior to June 1, 1962.”
