

ate preservation of the public health and safety, and having been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 15

(House Bill 11)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 108(16) (d) of Article 52 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1961 Supplement), title "Justices of the Peace," sub-title "Trial Magistrates System," relating to the service of civil process issued by the judges of the People's Court of Prince George's County and to the expense of serving such process.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 108(16) (d) of Article 52 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1961 Supplement), title "Justices of the Peace," sub-title "Trial Magistrates System," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

(d) The [superintendent of police] *Sheriff* of Prince George's County is hereby authorized, directed and required to serve all civil process issued by said judges. *The Sheriff shall be reimbursed by the County Commissioners for his expenses incurred in serving process.*

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1962.

CHAPTER 16

(House Bill 12)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 707A of Article 66C of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1961 Supplement), title "Natural Resources," sub-title "Oysters and Clams," to revise provisions for making a shellfish population survey in Talbot County waters.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 707A of Article 66C of the Annotated Code of Mary-
