“(j) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this section, the several legislative districts of Baltimore City shall each have six delegates during the four-year term of the General Assembly

which is elected to office in the month of November, 1962. Except for the provisions of this sub-section, all other provisions of this section shall apply to Baltimore City and its several legislative districts.”
