for himself and family free from rent, upon his keeping the several apartments C H A P. in his possession in sufficient repair, and taking a just and faithful charge and care of the entire premises.

VII. And be it enacted, That the said keeper shall be disqualified, during his Not to hold continuance in the faid office, from holding any ordinary or house of entertain- any ordinary, ment in the faid gaol, or at any other place, and from retailing spirituous liquors; and if the keeper of the faid gaol, or any of his domestics, shall fell spirituous liquors, or cause or suffer the same to be sold, to any of the prisoners confined in the faid gaol, or to any other person for the use of any of the said prisoners, and shall be convicted thereof, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten dollars for every offence.

VIII. and, in order to secure as much as possible the proper and humane treatment to prisoners confined in the said gaol, and to cause to be punished all persons who shall infringe the regulations provided for the same, Be it enaded, That it shall be the duty of the grand jury of the county to visit the faid gaol Jury to visit once in every term, and to inspect the several apartments thereof, and to inquire into the treatment of the several prisoners therein confined, and into their health and fituation, and to present, or otherwise report to the court, such facts and circumstances as they shall receive knowledge of, either upon their own view or from the evidence of other perfons; and the justices of the said court shall be and they are hereby empowered to act upon fuch presentments or reports, and to make such order therein as shall appear to them to be necessary to accomplish the defigns of this act respecting the regulation of the said gaol.

C. H A P. XVIII.

An ACT authorifing the justices of the levy court of Somerset Passed Januacounty to levy a fum of money on the affeffable property of the faid county for building a prison in the county, and other purposes therein mentioned.

HEREAS it is represented to this general affembly, that there is no Preamble. prison in Somerset county sufficient for the confinement of debtors or felons, which is very injurious to the peace and fecurity of the faid

county,

II. Be it enasted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Messieurs John Commission-Done, George Robertson, Levin Winder, William Jones, (Menokin,) Levin ersappointed, Gale, Zadock Long and John Stewart, or the major part of them, shall be commissioners, and are hereby authorised to purchase, for the use of Somerset county, a piece of ground in the town of Princess-Anne, in faid county, whereon to build a new prison; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby empowered to contract for materials, and to agree with workmen to build and finish the said prison, and to plan and superintend the said building until finished, which, when completed, shall, by the said commissioners, be put into the custody and possession of the sheriff of Somerset county for the time being, and so shall remain and continue in the custody and possession of such sheriff, and his successors, as a public prison for Somerset county.

III. And be it enaued, That the justices of the levy court for Somerset coun- Justices to lety, at the time of laying their next county levy, be and they are hereby autho- vy money, rised and directed to impose on the assessable property of the said county a sum not exceeding four thousand dollars, together with an allowance to the collector of fix per cent. for collection of the fame; which fum, when collected, shall, by the faid sheriff, be paid to the commissioners aforesaid, or the major part of them, to be by them applied in purchasing the ground, and erecting the said prison.

IV. And be it enacted, That the sheriff, or other person appointed to collect To be paid to the faid fum of money for the purpose aforesaid, shall pay the same to the faid the confioners, or the order of the major part of them, at or before the time
