juffices, or a majority of them, may adjourn from day to day until the faid roads shall be duly afcertained, and overfeers appointed as aforefaid.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the clerk of the court of faid county shall attend the justices Clerk to attend of the peace at their faid meetings, and shall make fair entries and records of their proceedings in virtue of this act, and shall, within the space of ten days after the appointment of overfeers as aforefaid, issue warrants to the said overseers, under his hand, and the seal of his office, notifying the said persons of their appointments respectively as overseers of the said roads, and the said clerk shall, within the time aforesaid, deliver the said warrants to the sheriff of Somerset county aforesaid, and shall take the receipt of the sheriff for the same; and the said sheriff shall be and he is hereby authorised and required, within the space of twenty days after Somerfet county aforefaid, and shall take the receipt of the sheriff for the same; and the said sheriff shall be and he is hereby authorised and required, within the space of twenty days after receiving the said warrants, to deliver the same to the respective persons appointed overseers as aforesaid, and to take their several receipts for the same; and if any of the said overseers shall result to receive their respective warrants, the said sheriff shall leave the same at their respective places of abode, and certify the justices of the peace thereof; and if the clerk or sheriff of the said county shall neglect or result to execute and perform the respective duties herein before required, within the respective periods limited as aforesaid, the said clerk or sheriff, so neglecting or resuling, shall forseit and pay a sum not exceeding thirty dollars for each offence.

IV. And be it enacted, That each and every person so appointed overseer as aforesaid, who shall neglect or refuse to accept of his appointment, after receiving his warrant as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten dollars; provided nevertheless, that no member of the legislature, magistrate, clergyman, schoolmaster, practising attorney, coroner, sherist, deputy-sherist, constable, physician, or commissioner of the tax, shall be liable to serve as overseers of the said roads, without his or their consent; and provided also, that no person shall be compellable to act as overseer of any road more than one year in every three years, without his consent. his confent.

V. And BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of the said overfeers to keep all the public roads in the said county well and sufficiently cleared and grubbed, fit for travelling, twenty feet wide at the least, and to make and keep good and substantial bridges over all the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and swamps, where the same shall be necessary, for the convenient and easy passage of travellers, with their waggons, carts, carriages, horses and cattle, and to remove all nuisances which may obstruct or annoy their passage, and well and sufficiently to causeway all and singular such places in and upon the said roads as shall require the same.

VI. Provided Always, That nothing in this act shall be considered to make it the duty of Proviso, overfeers of the roads aforesaid to make or repair any bridge or bridges above sisteen seet in length, but they shall continue to be built and repaired in the same manner as at present.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any of the faid overfeers shall not well and sufficiently Penalty for me clear, grub, amend and repair, the faid several and respective roads committed to their charge, sleet, &c. within a reasonable time after the same shall be out of repair, or shall not make and keep in repair good and substantial bridges over the heads of rivers, creeks, branches or swamps, where the same shall be necessary as aforesaid, or shall not remove all nuisances from the said roads, or shall fame thall be necessary as aforesaid, or shall not remove all nuttances from the said roads, or shall not well and sufficiently causeway all and singular such places in and upon the said roads as shall require the same, or shall permit or suffer any sallen trees, or other obstruction, to remain in or across any of the said public roads for the space of two days after notice thereof, or shall neglect to fell, or cause to be felled and removed, all decayed or dead trees on either side of the said public roads, whose limbs or any of them hang over the same, and may by their falling injure travellers, or shall not lop and cut off all limbs or branches of trees hanging or projecting over the faid roads, within fifteen feet above the furface thereof, or shall in any other manner fail or neglect to perform the duties of an overfeer of the faid roads, according to the directions of this act, every fuch overfeer, fo failing or neglecting, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding sive dollars for every offence, except in the time of wheat harvest.

VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful for the several and respective They may dig overfeers of the said roads, and they are hereby authorised and empowered, as often as need shall require, to dig, take and remove, any stones, gravel or earth, which may be found on any land adjoining the roads for which the same may be necessary, and to employ the same in the repairing of the said roads; and for the making or repairing of bridges over the heads of rivers, creeks, branches, swamps, or other low and miry places, through and over which the said roads may pass to cut down, or cante to be cut down, any tree or trees growing on any of the next may pass, to cut down, or cause to be cut down, any tree or trees growing on any of the next adjacent lands to such places where bridges or causeways may be necessary as aforesaid, and the same trees to maul and carry away from off such lands, and to apply the same to the making or repairing of the said bridges or causeways; provided always, that no enclosures shall be laid open or entered into to obtain the several materials aforesaid, or any of them, without the consent of the owner or owners thereof.

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That due compensation be made or secured to him or them by the Compensation county for the several materials aforesaid, according to the full value thereof, in such manner as to be made, &c. the justices of the levy court shall direct and appoint.

X. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid overfeers shall have power, and they are hereby authorised and required, to call for all and singular the able bodied free male inhabitants of their respective limits, above the age of twenty-one years and under the age of fifty years, and upon all and singular the able bodied male servants and slaves residing therein above the age of fixteen years and under the age of fifty years, to labour and affist in clearing, amending, improving and repairing, the several and respective roads aforesaid, and to require such and so many of the faid
