visions", to follow immediately after Section 39B thereof, to authorize the issuance of amusement park licenses in Washington County for the sale of beer therein subject to certain conditions.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That new Section 39C be and is hereby added to Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition and 1960 Supplement), title "Alcoholic Beverages", sub-title "Local Licenses and License Provisions", to follow immediately after Section 39B thereof, and to read as follows:

39C.

- (a) In Washington County the operators of any amusement park, whether individual, association of individuals, or a corporation, shall MAY be entitled to a license for the sale of beer within the confines of its park.
- (b) The fee for such license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) each calendar year, and shall entitle the holder to sell beer at one or more locations within the park from 8 A. M. to 12 P. M. on every day from May 1 to September 30 of each year, EXCEPT SUNDAYS AND ELECTION DAYS.
- (c) Such licensees shall be subject to all laws, rules and regulations applicable in Washington County to the sale of beer, not inconsistent with the provisions of this section; nothing contained in Section 41 of this article shall apply to any license issued pursuant to this section.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1961.

CHAPTER 717

(House Bill 620)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 400A of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1960 Supplement), title "Crimes and Punishments", sub-title "Minors—Obtaining Liquor", to prohibit the possession of alcoholic beverages with exceptions by minors in Washington County, to provide penalties for violations and to impose the jurisdiction of the juvenile court on violations by certain minors.
