of the said Code, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and all to read as follows:

32.

- (a-1) In addition to the provisions of sub-section (a) above, the judge of the Seventh Judicial Circuit resident in Charles County is authorized to appoint an official court reporter for the Circuit Court for Charles County at a salary to be fixed by the County Commissioners of Charles County on the recommendation of the resident judge of the County not to exceed the sum of \$6,500. annually. The County Commissioners shall be responsible for a sum equal to one-third of the salary of the court reporter. The clerk of the court shall pay the salary to the court reporter either monthly or semi-monthly out of the fees of office collected by the clerk. The clerk shall prior to May 1 of each year submit a voucher to the County Commissioners for payment of the one-third of the salary for which the County Commissioners are responsible and the Commissioners shall reimburse the clerk by no later than the above date.
- (b) Said reporters shall attend and take full stenographic notes of, or otherwise record, all oral testimony and judicial opinions in all proceedings in said courts at such times and in such cases as the respective courts may direct. Said reporters shall make and furnish to any party, upon request, a typewritten transcript of any part of said notes, upon the payment by such party of the expense incident to such transcript at a rate to be fixed by the court. The reporters shall perform such other duties as the court may direct.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1961.

CHAPTER 863

(House Bill 654)

AN ACT to repeal Sections 1 through 9, inclusive, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Charles County (1959 Edition, being Article 9 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Charles County", sub-title "Almshouse", and to repeal the sub-title "Almshouse", to repeal obsolete provisions in the local laws of Charles County relating to the trustees of the Poor, their powers and duties, and relating to the sale of the Almshouse Tract in the county.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 1 through 9, inclusive, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Charles County (1959 Edition, being Article 9 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Charles County", sub-title "Alms-
