Senate Bill No. 305 is a local bill that pertains only to Calvert County. The Sponsor of the bill, Senator Edward T. Hall, has advised my office that after this bill was approved by both houses of the General Assembly there was some question, lodged by the State Department of Health, relative to the wisdom of this legislation. Senator Hall has advised me that after consultation with the Health Department, a new bill was drawn, known as Senate Bill No. 571, approved by both houses of the General Assembly and was subsequently signed by me. Because of this, the Senator has requested that I veto this particular bill.

In compliance with this request, I have exercised my right to veto.

Senate Bill No. 459—Peddlers in Wicomico County

AN ACT to add new Section 24A to the Code of Public Local Laws of Wicomico County (1959 Edition, being Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Wicomico County", subtitle "Crimes and Punishments", to follow immediately after Section 24 thereof, making it unlawful in Wicomico County, with certain exceptions, to conduct the business of, or to act as an itinerant or door-to-door peddler or salesman of goods, wares or merchandise without a license, providing the conditions and procedures for the issue of such license and relating generally to itinerant or door-to-door peddlers or salesmen in Wicomico County.
