I, THOMAS B. FINAN, SECRETARY OF STATE OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, pursuant to the direction contained in Section 172 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, (1957 Edition), DO HEREBY CERTIFY, that at the General Election held in the State of Maryland on November 8, 1960, an Act known as Chapter 575 of the Acts of 1959, was submitted to the voters of the State of Maryland, pursuant to the provisions of Article 14 of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, said Act being as follows:

“An Act to propose an amendment to Section 41A of Article IV of the Constitution of Maryland, title ‘Judiciary Department’, sub-title ‘People’s Courts’, providing for candidates other than an incumbent judge to run for election to the People’s Court of Baltimore City, and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.”

AND I DO CERTIFY, that at said election 256,508 votes were cast in favor of the adoption of Chapter 575 of the Acts of 1959, and 160,762 votes were cast against adoption of said Chapter 575 of the Acts of 1959, the said Act has therefore been ratified by a majority of the qualified voters of the State of Maryland.
