nothing in this paragraph shall operate or be construed to diminish in any way the rights of any eligible members of the Police Department or of the Fire Department who are not participants in the presently existing general pension system of the City of Baltimore, their widows or dependents, to pensions, retirement benefits, other benefits or allowances provided for by laws or ordinances in force as of January 1, 1926. Until amended by ordinance, the presently existing pension and retirement systems of the City shall remain in force. The provisions of this paragraph shall be deemed to be in addition to and not in substitution of any other powers or authorizations now conferred upon the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1961.

CHAPTER 95

(House Bill 17)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 76 and 77 of Article 101 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1960 Supplement), title "Workmen's Compensation", sub-title "State Accident Fund", amending two sections of the laws relating to payroll records and the carrying of insurance policies in the State Accident Fund in order to correct errors in certain cross-references therein and further clarifying the provisions of these sections.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 76 and 77 of Article 101 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1960 Supplement), title "Workmen's Compensation", subtitle "State Accident Fund", be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

76.

- (a) Every employer subject to the operation and effect of this Article, who shall insure in the State Accident Fund, shall every four months, or at such other intervals as the Commissioners of the State Accident Fund shall direct, submit a report of his payroll to the Commissioners of the State Accident Fund, according to the regulations and requirements prescribed by the Commissioners. The payroll records of all employers insured in the State Accident Fund shall be open at all times to inspection by the said Commissioners and their authorized employees.
- (b) Upon the failure of an employer to comply with the requirements of the preceding paragraph of this Section, the Commissioners or Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the State
