

CHAP. IIII.

The commodities that may be procured in Maryland by industry.

Ee that well confiders the fituaation of this Countrey, and findes it placed betweene Virginia and New-England, cannot but, by his owne reason, conclude that it must needs participate of the naturall commodities of both places, and be capable of those which industry brings into either, the distances being so small betweene them: you shall find in the Southerne parts of Maryland, all that Virginia hath naturally; and in the Northerne parts, what New-England produceth; and he that reades Captaine Iohn Smith shall see at large discoursed what is in Virginia, and in Maher william wood, who this yeere hath written a trea-
