A Computation of a servants labour, and the profit that may arise by it, by instance in some particulars, which may be put in prassific the first yeere.

One man may at the season plant so much corne, as ordinarily yeelds of Wheate 100. bushels, worth upon the place, at Two shillings 2 Bushell.

Of Beanes and Peafe, 20. buflaels, worth at three faillings a bushell.

The same man will plant of Tobacco, betweene 800. and a 1000. weight, which at the lowest rate, at two pound 10. shill the hundred, is worth,

The same man may within the same yere, in the winter, make 4000. of Pipe-staves, worth upon the place source pound thethousand.

Beside all their other labours in building, fencing, clearing of ground, raising of Cattell, gardening, &c.
