able report was adopted, which was read the second time and ordered to be printed for a third reading.]

Also favorably Senate Bill No. 8, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 4 of Chapter 34 of the Acts of 1914, entitled 'An Act to enable the registered qualified voters of Garrett county to determine by ballot whether spirituous or fermented liquors shall not be sold in said county, or shall be sold only as hereinafter described, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with this Act, or any part of this Act."

Amendment proposed by Mr. Speicher: "Strike out all of Section 2." [Which was read and adopted.] [Which favorable report was adopted, which was read the second time and ordered printed for a third reading.]

Mr. Joy, from Select Committee, reported favorably Senate Bill No. 37, entitled "An Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Calvert County, Maryland, to levy a sum of money to build a schoolhouse for colored children on or near Back Creek, in Election District No. 1."

Amendment proposed by Mr. Joy: "Strike out all of Section 2." [Which was read and adopted.] [Which favorable report was adopted, which was read the second time and ordered printed for a third reading.]

The President laid before the Senate laid-over Bill, with amendments, being Senate Bill No. 27, entitled "An Act to authorize the President and Commissioners of Chesapeake City, Maryland, to issue bonds to pay off the present indebtedness of said town, growing out of a suit of Mrs. Josephine Pryor and others, and to pay for improvements hereafter to be made in and to the said town of Chesapeake City at the direction of the said the President and Commissioners of said town."

Amendment proposed by Select Committee: "Strike out all of Section 6." [Which was read and adopted.] [Which favorable report was adopted, which was read the second time and ordered printed for a third reading.]

At 1.10 o'clock P. M., on motion of Mr. Cooper, the Senate took a recess until 3 o'clock P. M.
