Senate Bill No. 90, entitled "An Act to repeal and reenact, with amendments, Sections 106-A, 106-B, 106-C and 106-D of Article 8 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title 'Cecil County,' sub-title 'County Commissioners,' as enacted by Chapter 387 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1894, Chapter 6 of the Acts of 1910, Chapter 150 of the Acts of 1910 and Chapter 625 of the Acts of 1908, and to repeal Section 106-BB of Article 8 of the Acts of 1914."

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS.

Senate Resolution No. —, introduced by Mr. Mudd:

WHEREAS, The State of Maryland, through its State Roads Commission, has completed the State road from Leonardtown in St. Mary's county to the District of Columbia line, thereby tending to afford the people of the entire southwestern section of the State an attractive means of transportation to the National Capital; and

WHEREAS, The road in the District of Columbia connecting with the aforesaid Maryland State road and leading towards the city of Washington, between the point of its connection with said State road and the top of Good Hope Hill in Anacostia, is poorly constructed, dangerous to traffic and
