year 1912; said new sections relating to the disbarment of attorneys at law from the practice of their profession in the State and before all the courts thereof."

[Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.]

Senate Bill No. 95, entitled "An Act to authorize the creation of a State debt in the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to complete the building of an armory for the Fourth Regiment Infantry, Maryland National Guard, authorized under Chapter 791 of the Acts of 1914, directing a State bond issue therefor and providing a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds and interest."

Senate Bill No. 98, entitled "An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland to the devise contained in the last will and testament of Susanna L. Wilson, late of Harford county, deceased, to the Deer Creek Harmony Church of Harford County, Maryland, of the sum of one hundred dollars."

[Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.]
