deemed to be a part of the cost and expense of repairing, extending and enlarging said plant, mentioned in Section 8 of Chapter 29 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1912." [Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Legg, Cooper and Archer.]

By Mr. Legg: Senate Bill No. 190, entitled "An Act to finally ratify, approve and confirm the expenditure by the municipal corporation, the Town Commissioners of Centreville, in the payment of the cost and expense of the grading and improvement of Water street in said town of Centreville, of the unexpended balance of twenty-nine hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,-950) remaining, after the completion of the grading and improvement of Commerce street, out of the sum of ten thousand one hundred and eighteen dollars and six cents (\$10,118.06) received by said municipal corporation, the Town Commissioners of Centreville, as the proceeds from the sale of the bonds issued and sold by said municipal corporation, pursuant to and by virtue of the power and authority conferred upon said municipal corporation by Chapter 440 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at its January session. 1914." [Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Legg, Cooper and Archer.]

By Mr. Kaufman: Senate Bill No. 191, entitled "An Act to appropriate the sum of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to the Maryland School for the Deaf, at Frederick, for its maintenance for the education of the deaf and dumb during the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1917, and the like sum of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to the same institution for its maintenance during the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1918." [Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.]

By Mr. Kaufman: Senate Bill No. 192, entitled "An Act to give the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland to a certain bequest in the last will and testament of Charles W. Haffman, late of Frederick county, Maryland, deceased, to the President and Council of Mt. St. Mary's College, near Emmitsburg, Frederick county, Maryland."
