By Mr. Norris, by request: Senate Bill No. 206, entitled "An Act to add three new and additional sections to Article XXI, of the Annotated Code of Public Civil Laws of Maryland, title 'Conveyancing,' sub-title 'Conditional Sales,' providing for a vendor's lien upon chattels personal, in favor of persons or corporations who sell, rent, hire or lease any goods, wares or merchandise, and in any written agreement or contract, recorded within twenty days from the execution thereof, reserve title in the vendor, said sections to follow immediately after Section 53, and to be numbered 53-A, 53-B and 53-C." [Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.]
