Also House Bill No. 16, entitled "An Act to add a new section to the Revised Charter of Baltimore city, to follow Section 171 and to be known as Section 171-A." [Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."] [Which was read the first time and referred to the City Senators.]

Also House Bill No. 9, entitled "An Act to repeal Chapter 403 of Article 15 of the Acts of 1910 of the General Assembly of Maryland, entitled 'Kent County.'" [Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."] [Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Brown, Cooper and Legg.]
