Whereupon Mr. Speicher moved that the Bill and proposed amendments be made the special order of the day for Thursday, February 24, 1916, at 4 o'clock P. M. [Which motion was lost.]

Whereupon the amendments proposed by the Committee were read and adopted.

The amendments proposed by Mr. Zihlman and printed in Senate Journal of February 18 were rejected.

Amendments proposed by Mr. Frick: "Strike out the words 'three-fifths,' in line 26 on page 6 of the printed Bill, and insert in lieu thereof the words 'a majority." [Which was read and adopted.]

Also, "Strike out from line 29 of page 6 of the printed Bill the words 'for schools.'" [Which was read and adopted.] [Which favorable report was adopted, which was read the second time and ordered printed for a third reading.]

At 11.30 o'clock P. M., on motion of Mr. Cooper, the Senate went into executive session.

At 11.35 o'clock P. M. the Senate resumed legislative business.
