

HOUSE BILLS—FIRST READING.

The President distributed the following message from the House of Delegates:

House Bill No. 54, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact Section 14 of Chapter 79 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, entitled 'An Act to amend Article 100 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Workhours of, in Factories,' by inserting therein five sections, to follow Section 13 thereof, and to be known respectively as Sections 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, under the sub-title 'Hours of Labor for Females.'" [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Labor.*]

Also House Bill No. 191, entitled "An Act to repeal Sections 156, 159, 164 and 165 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title 'Washington County,' sub-title 'Hagerstown,' and to re-enact the same with amendments." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Bomberger, Kaufman and Warfield.*]

Also House Bill No. 120, entitled "An Act to repeal Sections 2 and 5 of the Act of 1886, Chapter No. 113, entitled 'An Act to incorporate the Fire Insurance Salvage Corps of Baltimore, as amended by Chapter No. 72 of the Acts of 1888, and to re-enact the same with amendments.'" [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.*]

Also House Bill No. 82, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 4 of Article 23 of Bagby's Code of General Public Laws of 1914, titled 'Corporations,' sub-titled 'Provisions for Formation of Corporations.'" [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.*]

Also House Bill No. 187, entitled "An Act to authorize the Mayor and Council of the town of Easton, Talbot county, to sell and dispose of a tract of land known as the Potters Field." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Collier, Archer and Legg.*]
