Also House Bill No. 63, entitled "An Act to add three additional sections to Article 76 of the Annotated Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, titled 'Publication of Laws,' to be known as Sections 8, 9 and 10 of said Article 76, providing for the immediate printing and distribution of advance sheets of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, as they are enacted from time to time." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.*]

Also House Bill No. 23, entitled "An Act to pay Harry J. Whyte, of Worcester county, State of Maryland, the sum of two thousand dollars damages sustained by him on account of being shot and wounded whilst acting as one of a *posse comitatus* upon the order of, and whilst assisting Harding P. Tull, Sheriff of Somerset county, Maryland, to arrest certain alleged criminals in said Somerset county, Maryland." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.*]

Also House Bill No. 220, entitled "An Act to repeal Chapter 232 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the January Session in the year 1902, entitled 'An Act to require the County Commissioners of Talbot county to pay annually to the Commissioners of the town of Oxford in said county, a portion of the tax levied upon the property within the limits of the town of Oxford' and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Collier, Archer and Legg.*]

Also House Bill No. 161, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 201, 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207 and 208 of Article 43 of Bagby's Annotated Code of 1911, entitled 'Registration of Nurses,' as enacted by Chapter 172 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the Session of 1904, to provide for State Registration of Nurses." [*Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."*] [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Sanitary Condition of State.*]
