HOUSE BILL No. 7, BY MR. SMITH.

SUBJECT: SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF CERTAIN STATED POLITICAL UNITS OF THE STATE OF THE QUESTION OF WHETHER THE SALE OF SPIRITUOUS OR FERMENTED LIQUORS SHALL BE PERMITTED.

Amendment proposed by Mr. Norris: "Add a new section to the Bill, to be known as Section 6-A, and to read as follows:

"Section 6-A. This Act not to apply to, nor prohibit the manufacture for sale of alcoholic, spirituous, vinous, malt and intoxicating liquors, or the transportation thereof, where such liquors are manufactured for sale and sold only for delivery for shipment to places beyond the State, or to places within
