SENATE BILL No. 392, BY MR. COOPER.

SENATE BILL No. 326, BY MR. OGDEN.

SUBJECT: LICENSES—MOTOR VEHICLES—ROAD TRAFFIC.

With amendments as printed in the Senate Journal of March 9, 1916.

Amendment proposed by Mr. Williams: "On page 5 of the printed Bill, in line 136, strike out after the word 'provided' all down to and including the word 'rear.'"

Substitute amendment proposed by Mr. Norris: "On page 5, line No. 137, after the word 'vehicles,' and before the word 'not,' insert 'when within 15 miles of a city of 20,000 inhabitants or over, must be displayed.'" [*Which was read and rejected.*]
