By Mr. Mudd: Senate Bill No. 567, entitled "An Act to authorize and empower the Potomac River and Baltimore Railway Company, a corporation of the State of Maryland, and the Washington-Newport News Short Line, a corporation of the State of Virginia, to construct, maintain and operate a bridge and approaches thereto across the Potomac River."
