

216-U-3 and 216-U-4, to provide for the regulation of the hours of work for all laborers, workmen or mechanics employed by the Road Directors for Allegany county, on the public roads of Allegany county, under the control and jurisdiction of the said Road Directors of Allegany county; to further provide that a certain rate of per diem wages be paid to laborers, workmen and mechanics employed upon said roads; to provide that persons employed by contractors engaged in work for the Road Directors of Allegany county shall be considered employees of said Road Directors of Allegany county; to provide penalties for the violation of the provisions of this Act, and to provide that no laborers, workmen or mechanics, employed directly by the Road Directors of Allegany county, shall be paid less than two dollars (\$2) per diem." [Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."] [Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Zihlman, Speicher and Bomberger.]

Also House Bill No. 480, entitled "An Act to provide for the erection and equipment of a county high school at or near Prince Frederick, Calvert county, Maryland." [Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."] [Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Joy, Mudd and Chesley.]

Also House Bill No. 241, entitled "An Act to make uniform the law of acknowledgment to deeds or other instruments taken outside the United States, and to repeal and re-enact Section 5 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Laws, title 'Conveyancing' relating to acknowledgments without the United States." [Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."] [Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.]

Also House Bill No. 125, entitled "An Act to refund to the Sherwood Distilling Company, a corporation of the State of Maryland, a sum of money paid in error to the State Treasurer." [Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."] [Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.]

Also House Bill No. 423, entitled "An Act to amend the Act entitled 'An Act to incorporate the Preachers' Aid Society of Baltimore,' passed January 27, 1827; being Chapter 40 of the Laws of Maryland of 1826, and the re-affirmation of said Act passed at the January Session of the Legislature of 1858,
