By Mr. Norris: Senate Bill No. 591, entitled "An Act to amend Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Liquors and Intoxicating Drinks,' by adding a new section thereto to follow immediately after Section 688 and to be known as Section 688-A." [*Which was read the first time and referred to the City Senators.*]

By Mr. Allen, by request: Senate Bill No. 592, entitled "An Act to prohibit the sale of spirituous, fermented or malt liquors within three-quarters of a mile of Thistle Mills Store, at Ilchester, Baltimore county, Maryland," [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Temperance.*]

By Mr. Williams: Senate Bill No. 593, entitled "An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland to a gift and bequest contained in the last will and testament of William Wallace Spence, deceased, to and for the use and benefit of the Presbyterian Association of Baltimore city, a religious organization." [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.*]

By Mr. Frick: Senate Bill No. 594, entitled 'An Act to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 236 of Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, title 'Revenue and Taxes,' sub-title 'State Tax Commission,' as said section was enacted by Chapter 841 of the Acts of 1914." [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.*]

By Mr. Frick: Senate Bill No. 595, entitled "An Act to appropriate a sum of money to defray the cost of collecting and preserving facts, material to the history of Marylanders in the army and navy of the Confederate States of America; also those persons engaged in civic or other services under the authority of the government thereof, or civilians who voluntarily performed services helpful to the Confederate cause." [*Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.*]
