At 3.45 o'clock P. M. the tellers returned and submitted the following report:

We therefore report that no candidate having received a constitutional majority, there is no election.

M. on each and every day on which the General Assembly shall be in session, and that the procedure shall conform to the plan followed in taking the first ballot on January 20, 1916, and that balloting, as aforesaid, at the said hour shall continue from day to day, when sessions are held, and until a State Treasurer is chosen.
