TUESDAY, January 29th, 1856.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Heath presented a memorial of Chas. McLean and others, praying the reduction of tolls and chargers on the "Northern Central Rail Road Company,"

Which was referred to a Special Committee already to be appointed.

Mr. Reichard presented a petition of Andrew Hogmire, Andrew Rentch, and 72 other citizens of Washington county, praying an increase of five per centum on the taxable property in Washington county, for the support of Common Schools in said county;

Which was referred to the Washington county delegation.

Mr. Brengle presented a petition from 100 citizens of Frederick county, praying the Legislature to pass a law or laws, taxing all the real and personal property throughout the State, of every description, so that the burden of taxation may bear equally upon all, and that no property of any kind, be exempted, except such
