A bill entitled, an act authorizing the commissioners of Baltimore county to levy a tax upon the first election district of said county for the payment of the debt contracted by the commissioners of public schools under the act of 1832, chapter 287.

A bill entitled, an act relating to the grading and paving north avenue in the city of Baltimore, supplementary to an act entitled, an act to vest certain powers in the corporation of the city of Baltimore in relation to streets, passed on the 23d of March 1839;

A bill entitled, an act to fix the per diem of the county commissioners, judges of the orphans' court and trustees of the poor of Somerset county;
