

Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

And a bill, entitled an act relative to the establishment of a Light House on Drum Point, at the mouth of Patuxent river, in Calvert county, and to cede to the United States the jurisdiction of the State of Maryland in, to, and over a site for the same.

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Harris,

Three-fourths of the members concurring, the bill read the second time.
