Mr. Timmons from the Select Committee reported a bill entitled, an act to give the leave of the Legislature to the devisees and bequests of Ann P. White, late of Worcester county, deceased, for the relief of Pitts Creek congregation of the Presbyterian church, and of the Methodist Episcopal church in said county.

Also, on a bill entitled, an act to provide for the transcribing of certain records in the Register's office of said county.

Mr. Dorsey from the Select Committee reported a bill entitled an act appropriating a sum of money for the payment of the claims of James Murray, Thomas A. Mitchell, Samuel S. Riley, Chaney and Pritchard, John W. Davis, James H. League, Dixon, Parbrin & Co., James Hopkins, Noah Porter, John T. Watkins, J. Wesley White and James H. Iglehart, against the State of Maryland.
