Whereupon the Speaker declared that the Hon. Anthony Kennedy had been duly elected United States Senator for the term of six years, from the 4th of March, 1857.

Mr. Wickes submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the Committee appointed to investigate the existence of secret political societies in this State, report the progress they have made in such investigation, the number of witnesses they have examined under oath, and the names of such witnesses; and that they also report whether in the summoning of witnesses es they have selected those who have been as well as those who now are members of the American party.

On motion of Mr. Fiery,

The House adjourned.

Which was read.

Mr. Silver submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates, Tebruary 15th, 1856.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We have received your message, proposing that the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Delegates shall inform the Honorable Anthony Kennedy of his election as Senator in the Congress of the United States for the term of six years from the 4th of March 1857, and congur therein.
