And we have appointed on the part of the Senate, Messrs. McCullough and Schley tellers to act with the gentlemen named by your honorable body, to count the ballots and announce the results.

The House proceeded to the election of a State Treasurer, to supply the place of Dr. Dennis Claude, the present State Treasurer, when it appeared that forty-five ballots had been cast on the part of the House of Delegates. The Speaker pro tem, then sealed the ballot box and delivered the same into the hands of Messrs. Bowie and Dorsey, the tellers on the part of the House, who proceeded to the Senate Chamber to join those who had been appointed on the part of the Senate, for the purpose of counting the ballots.

After a brief absence the tellers on the part of the House returned and reported that with the tellers on the part of the Senate, they had counted the ballots cast for Treasurer, and that Dr. Dennis Claude had received 48 votes, Dennis A. Claude 2 votes, Dick Simpson 1 vote, and there were twelve blanks.
