Which was referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Rankin presented the petition of numerous citizens of Baltimore county, relative to the suppression of nunneries.

Which was referred to the Special Committee on that subject.

Mr. Chilcoat presented a petition of 140 citizens of Baltimore and Carroll counties, asking the erection of a bridge over the Patapsco Falls;

Which was referred to Baltimore county delegation.

Mr. Roberts presented a petition from 34 citizens of Talbot county, praying an endowment for the Military Academy at Oxford, Talbot county;

Which was referred to the Committee on Militia.

Mr. Lester from the Committee on Inspections, reported, unfavorably on the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to regulate inspections in the city of Baltimore, passed March 10th, 1851, chapter 200;

Which report was concurred in.

Mr. Dail presented the petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying an endowment of the Oxford Military Academy;

Which was referred to the Committee on Militia.

Mr. Partridge presented the petition of 203 inhabitants of Baltimore city, praying an endowment of the Oxford Military Academy;
